New "Read & Write" Toolbar

Read & Write is a literacy toolbar that enables students to reach their full potential. It is great for all students, all subjects and it helps students to understand, learn and express themselves with confidence.

Some features of the Read & Write toolbar:

- Text to Speech reads any text aloud with dual color highlighting and natural sounding voices
- Dictionaries a choice of dictionaries including picture and talking, along with various word prediction and translator tools
- Audio maker converts selected text into an audio file which can be saved in OneDrive
- Talk & Type turns the spoken word into text by dictating through the laptop microphone
- Vocabulary lists takes highlighted words and pulls them into a vocabulary list with dictionary definitions and an editable notes column


Read & Write will be available in September on all school district PCs and Surface devices as well as all iPads. It is designed as an intuitive and simple tool for support student learning. Kurzweil (which has been available district-wide in the past), will be phased out over the fall.

Teacher Laptop Updates

All teacher laptops will be wiped and reimaged with the new Windows 10 Education this summer. Once this has been done, techs will be able to update, trouble shoot and install software and printers remotely.

In order to complete this change, please save any files or data that you want to keep either in your "OneDrive" or on an external disk or thumb drive and leave your laptop and password in your school office by June 30th. As well, please leave confirmation that all data has been backed up.

Laptops will be available for pickup at your school prior to the District Summer Institute in August .

Surface Computers

Most schools will now have had their Surface devices delivered. These devices are domain login and it is important to remind students to fully "logout" after use. If there are any issues, please put in a work order as soon as they are noticed. Our tech department can now trouble shoot and often fix the Surfaces remotely which will greatly reduce the repair time.


Student 365 Accounts and Domain Logins

With the increase in use of technology by students, a couple of account related issues have arisen:

- It is difficult for students to change their passwords if their security has been compromised as it is currently done by the tech department.
- Students at different ages have different needs related to passwords. i.e. a grade 1 student may need a very simple password.

In order to try to solve these issues, student accounts will be deleted this summer. Please let all students know that their data will not be saved and they should save anything they need to a thumb drive.

Student accounts will be recreated for the fall. Teachers will be able to change passwords for their students (thereby making them as easy as needs be).

MyEd Parent Portal

The MyEd Parent Portal will allow students and families to view demographics, attendance, course selections (high school only), academic progress and transcripts. Some of the information available in the portal is dependent upon what a teacher chooses to share (course assignments, grades, etc.) while other is determined by the school district (attendance, report cards, assessments, etc.).

Any parents/legal guardians who have filled out their student's verification form with an email address and who have asked for portal access, will be receiving login information soon via email. If parents missed this enrollment window, they will have another opportunity in the fall.

If a parent forgets their user name, the school secretary can give them that information.

If a parent forgets their password, they can use the "Forgot my password" feature on the login page.
