Section Two: Word Study with Goals for Each Reading Stage

1.	Word Study Goals for Pre-Readers
	 Identify 40 or more upper- and lower case letters by name. Learn 8+ letter sounds. Hear and identify the initial consonant sound in a word. Write his or her own name. Learn correct letter formation.
2.	Word Study Goals for Emergent Readers
	 Identify all consonants and short vowels by name and sound. Form letters correctly. Hear and record sounds in consonant-vowel-consonant (CVC) words. Read and write about 30 high frequency words. Use knowledge of letters, sounds, and words to read and write simple texts.
3.	Word Study Goals for Early Readers
	 Monitor for visual information. (Does it look right?)
	• Use known words to problem-solve unknown words

4.	Word Study Goals for Transitional Readers	
	 Learn and use three-letter consonant clusters (str-, spr-, thr-). Learn and use silent e and vowel patterns to read and write new words. Understand spelling changes when adding inflectional endings (slam-slammed, happy-happily, country-countries). Sound the first part of the word and think about the story (ter-rific). Break words at the onset, rime, and ending (spr-int-ing). Break the word in syllables (ten-ta-cles). Break the word at the affix (im-polite). Break compound words (water-proof). Use analogies (boy-voyage). Always check for meaning. 	
5.	 Word Study Goals for Fluent Readers Break a polysyllabic word into syllables (de -reg – u – late)	□
