

Dear Interior Region families and students,

The new school year is upon us and we are committed to supporting a safe return to in-person classes, recreational, and social activities throughout the region.

We have worked closely with School District and provincial partners to develop <u>Public Health</u> <u>Communicable Disease Guidance for K-12 Schools</u>. In addition to this provincial guidance, due to increased COVID-19 activity throughout the Interior region, we have issued additional recommendations to School Districts including:

- Indoor assemblies are limited to 50 people or two classes (whatever is larger), in a single space.
- Visitors entering the school should be limited to those supporting activities that are of benefit to student learning and wellbeing (e.g. teacher candidates, immunizers, meal program volunteers, etc.).
- Extracurricular school sports should follow the <u>Interior Health Order</u> for Gatherings & Events, where sports and tournaments are allowed. Spectators should be limited to 50 people indoors and 100 people outdoors.

To ensure eligible people have as many options as possible to get immunized, Interior Health is bringing COVID-19 vaccine clinics to schools for students and staff. These clinic dates and times will be updated regularly as they are confirmed, please check for the latest school-hosted clinic dates here: https://news.interiorhealth.ca/news/covid-19-immunization-clinics/

As you may know, students 12 and older can provide "mature minor consent" to Interior Health by demonstrating they understand the benefits and risks of getting immunized.
