As students begin to receive admission decisions from Post-Secondary schools, it is also a great time to start looking into housing. Many post-secondary institutions offer on-campus housing options. It is strongly recommended that first year students take advantage of these options by applying for student housing immediately after accepting their offer of admission. Student housing is usually less expensive and often includes a meal plan at the campus cafeteria.

February/March is also a great time to research and apply for external scholarships (scholarships offered by organizations, companies, foundations, etc). Please visit the previously mentioned Post-Secondary and Careers page on the SD58 Website to get started in your scholarship search.
