As a District, we commit to the critical examination of policies, practices, systems, and beliefs and the implementation of corresponding actions to address the inequities that have and continue to negatively impact Indigenous learners, families, and communities.

This is and will continue to be challenging work, but together in classrooms, schools, and the district we can ensure that future generations know the truth of Canada's history and how to be active contributors towards reconciliation.

Today many of your children will have worn orange shirts and been a part of activities that support their learning and growth in the area of Truth and Reconciliation. Tomorrow we are also all encouraged to wear an orange shirt as a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations. We especially hope that for all of you, tomorrow is a day of reflection, conversation, and learning.
