School District 58 Nicola-Similkameen selects YMCA BC as operator of new childcare spaces in Princeton community

January 11, 2024, Merritt and Princeton communities, BC – School District 58 Nicola-Similkameen is pleased to announce that YMCA BC has been selected as the partner and future operator of new childcare spaces at the Riverside Learning Centre. This project is the first between YMCA BC and School District 58 in the Princeton community and is an example of a school district bringing a childcare operator to the table early in the process. This allows the YMCA, as experts in this field, to be play an integral role in the planning and design of high-quality childcare spaces and experiences.

As the need for quality childcare services across the province is ever increasing, today's announcement is both exciting and significant for parents and caregivers in the Princeton community. With the addition of these new spaces, which are supported through the ChildCareBC New Spaces Fund, Riverside Learning Centre will provide 24 Infant-Toddler spaces, 50 spaces for Group 30 months to School Age spaces, and 48 Before and After School spaces. These spaces include the existing childcare spaces that are currently provided by the wonderful team of educators at Little Seeds Early Learning Centre.

With the opening of Riverside Learning Centre spaces on the horizon and the ongoing need for accessible and quality childcare in British Columbia, there is no better time to pursue a career in Early Childhood Education. Becoming a childcare educator provides individuals with a unique opportunity to give back to their local communities and make a lasting impact in the lives of children and their families. For those interested in a career as an Early Childhood Educator (ECE), information about certification, the Province of BC's ECE Education Support Fund and other government funding resources can be found HERE. Additionally, anyone who would like to work in a BC licensed childcare facility with school age children must be 19+ and will require the Responsible Adult Certification (RAC). The RAC certification course is currently offered for FREE through the YMCA Ignite digital platform.
